Course selection for incoming students:	<p>If needed, exchange students may mix lectures from different degree programmes, provided there are no time clashes. This does not apply to iLab and EPS.</p> <p>Subjects offered in the 1st, 3rd and 5th semester can only be chosen in the winter semester. Subjects offered in the 2nd, 4th and 6th semester can only be chosen in the summer semester.</p> <p>Incoming students wishing to take subjects from the master degree programmes must have sufficient knowledge of the respective subjects, as all of these courses are at an advanced level.</p>
