- thereby making a contribution to society.


The iLab Process

In the iLab, you are part of a human-centred design process. In this process, you go through multiple iterations.

The objective is to

- explore and identify the true causes of these challenges as well as the needs of the affected users.
- develop a needs-oriented solution that generates added value for the users.

You have to pass two gates in the process. Within the framework of these decision-making situations, the teams present their developed solution ideas and prototypes to a jury made up of experts from various professional fields. After each gate, new teams are formed and the participants continue to work on their challenges in these new constellations.



Acquistion of Competencies

The iLab creates a learning environment that will help you to acquire and train future professional skills in a very practical and independent way.

- At the personal level: independence, self-management, communication and feedback skills, reflectivity
- At the team level: interdisciplinary collaboration, team dynamics, solutions for challenging situations
- At the project level: design thinking, business design, agile project management




